- 41. *Farther* refers to distance; *further* is for time, intensity, or duration.
- 42. Effected can be a verb, but as such it means "to be the sole agent of change." In this sentence "influenced" is the more likely meaning, so affected is the one you want.
- 43. A lot is always written as two words.

- 44. *All ready* as two words means "completely prepared," but in this sentence you want "by this time," which is the definition of *already*.
- 45. *Everyday* as one word means "ordinary." As two words, it means "daily," the one you want here.
- 46. All right is always two words, never one.
- 47. Sat is the past tense of *sit*, which is the verb you want for plopping your body in a chair. Set is to place something else somewhere else.
- 48. *Irregardless* doesn't exist, but *regardless* expresses the same idea.
- 49. *Lie* is to rest or recline; *lay* (in the present tense) is to put something down somewhere. Demos wants to rest, so *lie* is appropriate.
- 50. *Fifty books* is plural, so *more than* comes into play. *Over* is for singular terms.
